



FP7

- Special attention to SMEs in the Work programme 2013 (published in July 2012)
- 75 %
- €1.2 billion, including:
- €970 million financing for SMEs out of the €4.8 billion call budget for Cooperation.
- Specific budgets for SMEs in 9/10 themes.
- €250 million for the Research for the benefit of SMEs
- By the end of FP7 (2007–2013) approx. 30,000 SMEs will have received around €7.3bn

EU financial instruments for R&I

- Risk-Sharing Finance Facility (RSFF) for debt (FP7+EIB)
- High-Growth and Innovative SME Facility (GIF) for equity (CIP): investments in specialised funds providing venture capital for SMEs. Early and growth stage

- Innovation Management self-assessment tool: Innovation Management consulting process & benchmarking

- <u>Europe INNOVA</u> online tools & multimedia presentations



Horizon 2020

- Targets innovative SMEs
- SME participation across Horizon 2020
- SMEs → min. 15% total combined budgets of Tackling societal challenges and Leadership in enabling and industrial technologies
- Collaborative projects
- Marie Curie Actions
- Future and Emerging Technologies (FET)
- Innovation in SMEs

H2020: Specific objective Innovation in SMEs

• €619 million budget

- a) Eurostars: a specific action for researchintensive SMEs
- b) new experimental types of SME innovation support, e.g. assistance to SMEs to connect with research and innovation partners across EU(spin-in projects).
- c) support for market driven innovation (e.g. procurement networks)

COSMEI

- € 2.5 billion from 2014 to 2020
- Strengthening the competitiveness and sustainability of European enterprises
- Encouraging entrepreneurship and promoting SMEs
- Main target audience: SMEs, entrepreneurs, business support organisations, regional and national administrations

COSME II

- Enterprise Europe Network EEN to be strengthened
- integrated R&I-related SME support currently spread across several programmes and initiatives ,,into one comprehensive, simple and easily accessible scheme".
- Only SMEs will be able to apply for funding
 single company support possible → market relevance and increased commercialisation of project results.

COSME III

Objectives

- facilitating access to finance for SMEs
- creating an environment favourable to business creation and growth
- encouraging entrepreneurial culture in Europe
- increasing sustainable competitiveness of EU companies
- helping SMEs operate outside their home countries and improving their access to markets

Financial instruments (equity and debt) to support SMEs I

- Greater use of financial instruments
- leverage further private R&I investments, including venture capital for innovative, high-tech companies
- H2020 budget proposal foresees € 3.5 billion for financial instrument facilities for R&I
- At least one-third for SMEs and small midcaps.

Financial instruments (equity and debt) to support SMEs II

- **Debt facility:** loans, guarantees and other forms of debt finance to entities of all forms and sizes, including R&I-driven SMEs
- Equity facility: finance for early- and growth-stage investments, with a particular focus on early-stage SMEs with the potential to carry out innovation and grow rapidly.
- EIB Group and/or other international financial institutions and national intermediaries.
- In conjunction with financial instrument of COSME (€1.4 billion has been allocated to debt and equity financing in support of SMEs).

Equity Facility for R&I (H2020)

- o focus: early stage
- o final beneficiaries: innovative SMEs and small midcaps
- o also covering growth-stage investments up to 20%* of total EU investment

Equity Facility for Growth for SMEs (COSME)

- o focus: growth stage
- o final beneficiaries: growth-oriented SMEs
- o also covering early stage investments up to 20% of total EU investment

Multi-stage funds: contribution of resources from COSME and H2020 on a pro-rate basis
